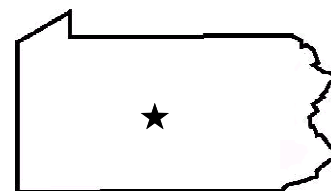

Season Highlight:

Philipsburg-Osceola Mounties - Record: 25-1 (District 6 Champions, Mountain League Champions)

The 2010 Mountie softball team earned a program-best 25 wins on the season, including two wins each against perennial state-powerhouse Bald Eagle Area, and 2010 PIAA Class AAA state finalist Bellefonte on its way to the school's 8th District 6 title and 14th Mountain League title. This is the Mounties third trip to the PIAA championship game, having earned berths in the 2000 and 2007 seasons. Philipsburg-Osceola won the PIAA Class AA state championship in 2007 with an 11-6 win over Brandywine Heights, setting the PIAA record for hits in a game (18) and tying the PIAA softball record for runs in a game with 11.

The Mounties are led by an offense that has set single-season team records in hits (266), total bases (384), doubles (56), triples (16) and slugging percentage (.550). The team also owns the second-highest all-time batting average (.381). Defensively, the team has set the school's all-time record for fielding percentage (.970) and boasts the third-best runs-allowed in a season, averaging just 1.1 runs-against per contest. This combination of offense and defense has led the Mounties to a 25-1 record entering the 2010 state championship game. The Mounties earned wins against Bald Eagle Area (13-0), D7-3 Waynesburg (7-1), D7-2 Burrell (5-1) and D10-1 Wilmington (10-0) on their way to the state championship game.
